A federal court appointed the Monitor to oversee the NYPD's reform of its stop, question, and frisk practices and to ensure those practices align with the Constitution.





The Monitor's Role

Under the Court's order, the Monitor's powers are limited to an oversight role.

What the Monitor Does:

- Evaluates the NYPD's stop-and-frisk practices
- Assesses the NYPD's compliance with the constitution and applicable laws
- Reports findings to the federal court in public filings
- Recommends ways NYPD can improve compliance and accountability

The Monitor's Role

The Monitor has limited authority.

What the Monitor Does Not Do:

- The Monitor does not have authority to review policing issues unrelated to stop-and-frisk.
- The Monitor cannot draft or pass new laws.
- The Monitor cannot discipline officers.
- The Monitor does not investigate individual officers.
